

## Asbestos FAQ

What is James Hardie's history in relation to making products that contained asbestos?

- Up to 1987, James Hardie was involved in the manufacture and distribution of a variety of products that contained asbestos, including building products, pipes, brake linings and insulation products.
- In 1981, James Hardie pioneered the manufacture of the world's first asbestos free fibre cement products.
- James Hardie ceased using asbestos in its building products in 1985 and in its pipes business in 1987. Since then, James Hardie products have been and continue to be asbestos-free.

How is James Hardie contributing to asbestos disease related compensation?

- James Hardie entered into an agreement with the NSW Government on arrangements aimed at ensuring ongoing funding for compensation payments to claimants suffering from asbestos related diseases arising from products manufactured by James Hardie's former subsidiaries.
- Given the long-term nature of this agreement, which will last until at least 2045, its terms seek to balance the needs of all stakeholders including both current and future claimants. For this reason, it is important that James Hardie remains a healthy and thriving business so that we are able to continue to contribute to the long term funding of claims.
- As at May 2024, James Hardie has, collectively paid over \$2.2 billion to fund compensation payments and asbestos education and medical research.
- James Hardie continues to contribute funds to the Asbestos Injuries Compensation Fund (the AICF), in accordance with the Amended and Restated Final Funding Agreement (AFFA). This commitment extends to at least 2045, with recurring automatic ten year extension periods, if required.
- Collectively James Hardie has provided over \$2.2billion towards asbestos disease related compensation, medical research and education since 2001.
- No proven compensation claim against James Hardie (or its former subsidiaries) has gone unpaid.
