

The Modern Coastal look is a contemporary take on traditional coastal design. The style is inspired by the Australian way of life and beach shack history, modernised with an injection of sleek minimalism. Being harmonious with climate whilst connecting to the architectural history of the region is the benchmark for this style.

Modern Coastal homes are defined by spaces that lend themselves to a laid-back, luxurious lifestyle where the lines between indoor and outdoor are blurred. These homes are foundationally open-plan beach houses where occupants feel free to move around. The layout is enveloped by large-span windows and wide entrances to capture the sunlight and beachside.

On the facade, the flexible roof styles range from a bold gable, flat roof or skillion roof to provide a designer look. Well chosen, generous windows can be enhanced with hoods or vertical screens to provide shading and showcase the landscaping from all angles of the home. Crisp white weatherboards combine with textured cladding to marry minimalist and coastal design, amplifying a nostalgic ambience for carefree summer days. Interiors are light-filled and breezy, featuring lightweight furniture, natural textures and soft shades of green and blue.

Design features

1 Flexible roof

An angular skillion roof, bold gable or flat roof style adds clean lines to the facade and evokes a contemporary coastal architectural style.

2 Weatherboard exterior

The facade typically features crisp white cladding, such as weatherboards, adding coastal charm without the maintenance of traditional timber.

3 Light colour palette

Whites, light greys, beiges and muted pastel tones evoke a fresh and airy coastal palette and create a sense of spaciousness.

4 Indoor-outdoor connection


Interior and exterior spaces are seamlessly connected through sliding glass doors, louvres and screens, creating an abundance of indoor-outdoor living areas.

5 Interiors

Pale timbers and white plaster create a sense of light and spaciousness inside with complementary natural textures and neutral coastal tones of soft greens and blues adding to the fresh, contemporary feel.

Cladding solutions

Hardie[™] exterior cladding delivers the fresh facade typical of the Modern Coastal home. Crisp, white, lightweight cladding such as weatherboards, add coastal charm without the hassles of traditional timber.

Linea™ Weatherboard

The strong shadow lines of this weatherboard nods to a traditional beach house or Queenslander style with a modern twist. Using Linea™ Aluminium Corner Soakers differentiates from a more traditional Hamptons look which has trim covering the corners.

These flowing lines are ideal for creating Modern Coastal facades with a finish that's visually sophisticated and dynamic.


Axon[™] Cladding





- The Modern Coastal aesthetic centres on natural textures, soft shades and organic materials.
- 2 The versatility of microcement adds depth to interior and exterior walls.
- 3 The natural colours and patterns of sandstone are easy to maintain.
- 4 The smooth, semi-matte finish of satin tiles can mimic colours of sand, skies and sea.
- 5 The light and airy feel of smooth, whitewashed wood.
- 6 Vertical slats add texture to garage and other exterior doors.
- 7 Textured linens in neutral tones add a soothing quality to the coastal interior.
- 8 The natural hues of jute rugs work inside and equally outside in covered areas of the Modern Coastal home.







Colours in the Modern Coastal home are designed for tranquility and connection.
